This act establishes the Missouri Empowerment Scholarship Accounts Program which is designed to allow individuals to make contributions to educational assistance organizations certified by the state treasurer. The educational assistance organizations will then distribute the money received to qualified students in a manner chosen by the parents of the student. Students with disabilities are considered qualified students. The act specifies what types of educational supplies and other services the money can be used for. Individuals who make a contribution to an educational assistance organization will be allowed

to claim a tax credit beginning with the 2019 tax year.
