ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY

*HB 1436 - Newman

Adds an individual with mental disabilities to the list of people who must be afforded the same rights as those without disabilities in public places and the right to be accompanied by a service dog

This act adds mental disability to the definition of service dog and adds search and rescue of an individual with a disability to the list of tasks a service dog can perform. The act also adds the definition of a type of service dog called a search and rescue dog to the law and adds the term service team dog to the law. It affirms the right of people with disabilities other than a visual or hearing disability to be accompanied by a service dog in public places or a service dog team member to have the same right.

*HB 1410 - Walton Gray

Allows certain inmates who become physically or mentally disabled, infirm, incompetent, or incapacitated to be released on parole if they are eligible for specified federal medical or financial benefits

This act allows the board of probation and parole to release on parole an offender who is sentenced to or is incarcerated in a correctional institution for five or more years, does not pose a danger to others, is eligible for federal medical, psychological, and financial benefits, and who is or becomes physically or mentally disabled, infirm, incompetent, or incapacitated to the degree that he

or she needs to be permanently placed in an infirmary, health or mental health facility so that he or she can be placed in such a facility. The act outlines criteria the board of probation and parole should utilize when determining whether an offender poses a danger to others.

Changes the elements of the crime of causing substantial injury or death to a service animal

This act adds reckless disregard to the definition of the already established crime such that anyone who with reckless disregard injures or kills a service animal or allows a dog he or she owns or is in control of to injure or kill a service animal is guilty of a class A misdemeanor, and anyone who with reckless disregard interferes with or permits another dog to interfere with a service animal as outlined above, or interferes with the use of a service animal by obstructing, intimidating, or jeopardizing the safety of the service animal or its user is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. Any second or subsequent violation is a class A misdemeanor. If someone intentionally injures or kills a service animal or allows a dog to injure or a kill a service dog, the individual is guilty of a class D felony. The act also states that the individual must make full restitution for all damages and outlines what types of costs would be considered damages.

This act adds professional therapy dogs to the definition of "service dog" as it relates to crimes against the animals or crimes of impersonating someone with a disability. A professional therapy dog is defined in this act to mean a dog selected,

trained, and tested to provide specific physical therapeutic functions under the direction and control of a qualified handler who works with dog as a team as part of the handler's occupation or profession.

Under current law, a person who recklessly and purposely causes serious injury to an elderly person commits the crime of second degree elder abuse. This act makes it so a person who recklessly or purposely causes such injury has committed the crime.

This act adds undue influence to the types of acts that, when committed against an elderly or disabled person, constitute the crime of financial exploitation. Undue influence is defined under the act to mean influence by a person who has authority over the elderly or disabled person in order to take unfair advantage of the person's vulnerable state of mind, neediness, pain, or agony. It includes improper use of various types of fiduciary authority.

Currently, the Rebuilding Communities tax credit program has a ten million dollar annual cap. If there are tax credits remaining under the cap, up to 100,000 dollars of this tax credit cap shall first be used for the residential dwelling accessibility tax credit. This act repeals the requirement that tax credits under the Rebuilding Communities tax credit cap be provided to the residential dwelling accessibility tax credit.

This act states the qualifications for use of marijuana for medicinal purposes and sets regulations for how the individual using it for medicinal purposes should be treated by law enforcement personnel. Individuals who have a debilitating medical condition as outlined in this act who possess written certification from a physician that the marijuana would be of medical benefit to the patient will be allowed to possess an adequate supply of the marijuana as long as the supply does not exceed the limits set in this act without fear of arrest, prosecution or penalty. The property and equipment of the individual allowed to use the marijuana should not be destroyed or harmed by law enforcement personnel.

A parent must consent if the individual is a minor.

The Department of Health and Senior Services will issue registry identification cards to all patients and will formulate rules for handling applications for the registry identification cards. The act states what information must be included on or with the application and on the identification card.

The act outlines when and where medical marijuana may not be used.

All individuals will be allowed to use the documentation stated in the act as a defense against a marijuana charge.

The act outlines requirements for organizations to sell, deliver, distribute, dispense, or possess medical marijuana

whether to release the offender on probation. While on probation the individual will be enrolled in a community psychiatric rehabilitation program. Recommendations will be submitted to the governor and the general assembly regarding program expansion at the end of the pilot program.
