Beginning in the 2016-2017 school year, any licensed educator may annually complete up to two hours of training or professional development in youth suicide awareness and prevention as part of the professional development hours required for State Board of Education certification.

The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education must develop guidelines for training or professional development in youth suicide awareness and prevention. The Department must also develop materials that may be used for such training or professional development.

Each district must adopt a policy for youth suicide awareness and prevention by July 1, 2017. The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education must develop a model policy by July 1, 2016, that districts may adopt. The Department must cooperate, consult with, and seek input from organizations that have expertise in youth suicide awareness and prevention. By July 1, 2020, and every three years thereafter, the Department must request information and seek feedback from districts on their experience with the policy for youth suicide awareness and prevention. The

Department shall review this information and use it to adapt the department's model policy. The Department must post the information it receives from districts on its website.

The act specifies the criteria on which the analysis will be based. It requires the department to submit a report of the actuarial findings to the House Speaker, the Senate President Pro Tem, and the House and Senate committees that have jurisdiction over health insurance issues by December 31, 2016.

This act states that no hospital or health care provider that receives funding from MO HealthNet can refuse to provide services to or contract with the Department of Corrections or any Department contractor for health care services to individuals who are incarcerated in a MO corrections facility. The act states that the payment amount for providing a health care service to an individual in a corrections facility will be no more than 100% of the MO HealthNet or Medicare reimbursement rate. Whether the MO HealthNet rate or the Medicare rate is used will be determined by which is the larger amount. The act specifies the larger rate should be used. The Department can request the Attorney General seek injunctive relief from any hospital or health care provider that does not comply.
