## <u>HB 1570 – Ervin (R)</u>

Changes the laws regarding health insurance to comply with the federal Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act Changes the laws regarding health insurance to comply with the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). The sections of the bill that relate to people with disabilities include; Health Maintenance Organizations (HMOs) Proof that a dependent child is incapable of maintaining employment due to a mental or physical handicap and is dependent upon the policy holder for support and maintenance must be submitted to the insured's HMO within 31 days, instead of the current at least 31 days, after the child has attained the age when the child's coverage is to be terminated. Currently, group health insurance policies must specify any exclusions and limitations to the policy regarding a disease or physical condition that an individual was treated for during the 12 months prior to the effective date of the coverage. The bill limits the exclusions and limitations to the prior six months before the enrollment date of the coverage. Exclusions and limitations cannot apply to a loss or disability that occurred 12 months after the enrollment date or, in the case of a late enrollee, 18 months from the enrollment date. Proof that a dependent child is incapable of maintaining employment due to a mental or physical handicap and is dependent upon the policy holder for support and maintenance must be submitted to the health insurer within 31 days, instead of the current at least 31 days, after the dependent child has attained the age when coverage is to be terminated. Missouri Health Insurance

Portability and Accountability Act The State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP) coverage is added to the list of credible coverage for individuals under the Missouri Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, and the definition for "waiting period" as it relates to the act is revised to be the time period that must pass before coverage for an employee or dependent who is otherwise eligible to enroll in a group health plan can become effective. Any time period before late or special enrollment is not considered a waiting period for late or special enrollees. A waiting period begins on the date an individual submits a substantially complete application for coverage and ends on the date coverage begins or when the application is denied or lapses. Individual Health Insurance Policies Proof that a dependent child is incapable of maintaining employment due to a mental or physical handicap and is dependent upon the policy holder for support and maintenance must be submitted to the health insurer within 31 days, instead of the current at least 31 days, after the dependent child has attained the age when coverage is to be terminated. Missouri Health Insurance Pool (MHIP) The bill adds recipients of coverage under the State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP) to the list of individuals with credible coverage under the MHIP and changes the definition of a "dependent" to be an unmarried child that is medically certified as disabled and dependent upon the parent, or a state resident younger than 19 years of age who is not eligible for any other group or individual coverage or entitled to state or federal health benefits.

# *Proposes a constitutional amendment changing the* laws regarding voter identification Upon voter approval, this proposed constitutional amendment requires persons seeking to vote to provide election officials with a photographic personal identification including a valid Missouri driver's license or nondriver's license and cards or documents with photographs or a digital image issued by the Missouri National Guard, the United States armed forces, or the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. Other documents with both a signature and photograph issued by Missouri or the United States may also be used to establish a voter's eligibility to vote. The state must provide at least one form of identification at no cost to any otherwise qualified citizen who desires one. Individuals born on or before January 1, 1941, who have disabilities or who have religious objections to photographic identification may vote by provisional ballot. The Secretary of State will provide notification of the new voting requirements through

a variety of media advertisements and public service announcements and the information must also be posted on the opening page of the official Internet web site of the Secretary of State and the Governor of the new requirements. The Director of the Department of Revenue must prepare and provide an annual report by January 1 to each member of the General Assembly documenting the number of individuals who have requested and received a nondriver's license photo identification for voting purposes.

## SB 812 – Schmitt (R)

Relating to Multiple Sclerosis license plates Allows motorists to obtain Multiple Sclerosis special license plates. In order to obtain the specialty plates, the motorist must pay an annual \$25 emblem-use contribution to the National Multiple Sclerosis Society, a \$25 specialty license plate fee, and regular registration fees. The specialty

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plates shall bear the words "JOIN THE MOVEMENT" in lieu of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Before these specialty plates may be issued, the director must receive in receipt of a list of at least 200 potential applicants who plan to purchase the plate and an application fee to defray the cost for developing the specialty plate. **Status:** 1/21/10 First Read (S) Issue 3
