<u>HB 1879 – Grisamore (R)</u>

Requires every public school district to provide disability history and awareness instruction during the month of October and designates October as "Disability History and Awareness Month"

Each district school board shall require all K-12 public schools within the district to provide disability history and awareness instruction each year during the month of October. The month of October shall be designated "Disability History and Awareness Month". During disability history and awareness month, students shall be provided intensive instruction to expand their knowledge, understanding, and awareness of individuals with disabilities, the history of disability, and the disability rights movement. Disability history shall include the events and timelines of the development and evolution of services to, and the civil rights of, individuals with disabilities. Disability history shall also include the contributions of specific individuals with disabilities, including the contributions of acknowledged national leaders. The instruction shall be integrated into the existing school curriculum in ways including, but not limited to, supplementing lesson plans, holding school assemblies, or providing other school-related activities. The instruction may be delivered by qualified school personnel or by knowledgeable guest speakers, with a particular focus on including individuals with disabilities. The goals of the disability history and awareness instruction include: 1. an understanding that disability is a natural part of the human experience; 2. the creation of a more inclusive school community; 3. reaffirmation of the local, state and federal commitment to the full inclusion in society of, and the equal opportunity for all individuals with disabilities; and 4.institutions of higher education within the state are encouraged to conduct and promote activities on individual campuses that provide education, understanding, and awareness of individuals with disabilities.

Beginning January 1, 2011, this bill increases from \$14,300 to \$16,000 the minimum base used to calculate the senior citizens property tax credit, commonly known as circuit breaker.

Limits increase in assessed valuation of residential property by the percentage of increase in Social Security benefits for the elderly and disabled who own and live in their principal residence Beginning January 1, 2011, this bill limits the increase in assessed valuation of residential property to the percentage of increase in Social Security benefits in the previous year for an individual who is 65 years of age or older or who is disabled, has a federal adjusted gross income of less than \$72,380, and owns and lives in his or her principal residence. The maximum income limit will increase by the same incremental increase in the general price level as specified in the Missouri Constitution. The provisions of the bill will expire December 31 six years from the effective date.
