However, the institution cannot ask the nature of the disability or impairment but only whether or not the individual is impaired or the adult is trained in handling service dogs. Any rules of an educational institution that limit or restrict a dog's size or access to areas of the institution available to persons without disabilities cannot apply to service dogs.
