
Office of Administration **GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL ON DISABILITY**

HB 203 - Hoskins

Issue 3

Includes professional therapy dogs in the definition of service dogs for purposes of certain crimes relating to such animals

To repeal section 209.200, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to professional therapy dogs. "Professional therapy dog," a dog which is selected, trained, and tested to provide specific physical therapeutic functions, under the direction and control of a gualified handler who works with the dog as a team as a part of the handler's occupation or profession. Such dogs, with their handlers, perform such functions in institutional settings, community-based group settings, or when providing services to specific persons with disabilities. Professional therapy dogs do not include dogs, certified or not, which are used by volunteers in visitation therapy.

Modifies the law relating to the Missouri Human Rights Act and employment discrimination

This act changes the standard from one of contributing to one of motivating as it relates to employment discrimination. The act modifies the definition of "employer." This act directs courts to follow judicial interpretations of the ADA and other laws when deciding employment discrimination cases.

SB 134 - Rupp

Issue 3

Outlines the parental rights of individuals with disabilities in termination of parental rights cases

This act modifies provisions relating to termination of parental rights as it relates to parents with disabilities. The act specifies that the disability of a parent shall not constitute a basis for a determination that a child is in need of care, for the removal of custody of a child from the parent, or for the termination of parental rights without a specific showing that there is a causal relation between the disability and harm to the child. In such cases involving termination of parental rights, the court shall consider the availability and use of accommodations for the disability of the parent, including assistive technology and support services. MENTAL HEALTH

HB 302 - Black

Authorizes the director of the department of corrections to establish a mental health assessment pilot program

The director of the department of corrections is authorized to establish, as a three-year pilot program, a mental health assessment process. A judge in certain criminal cases may request that an offender undergo a 120 day mental health assessment and then treatment if it appears the offender may have a mental illness or mental disorder so that the offender may qualify for probation including community psychiatric rehabilitation programs. The department of corrections will determine eligibility for the assessment process.

HB 300 - Gatschenberger

Establishes the High School Sports Brain Injury Prevention Act which requires school boards to work with the Missouri State High School Activities Association to develop guidelines regarding head injuries

This act creates the High School Sports Brain Injury Prevention Act. It specifies that guidelines and other information should be established to educate interested parties about concussion and head injury. Parent forms should be signed each year. Protocol will be established for occurrences of athlete head injuries.

HB 334 - Barnes

Enacts provisions relating to the prevention and treatment of sports-related concussions and other head injuries among student athletes

The act amends Section A. Chapter 167, RSMo and adds sections 176.760 and 176.62. The act instructs the Department of Education to develop and implement an interscholastic athletic head injury safety training program and an educational fact sheet about sports-related concussions and other head injuries. Each school district is instructed to develop a policy relating to sportsrelated concussion prevention and treatment. A guideline is also outlined for what should occur with the student athlete following concussion or head injury.
