This act gives students at Missouri institutions of higher education which are funded in part by state revenue the right to record public lectures presented in a classroom environment for personal use. This act does not waive or infringe upon any institutional policies related to copyright, trademark, or intellectual property interests. It also does not permit the recordings to be disseminated. **Status:**

Modifies the law relating to the Missouri Human Rights Act and employment discrimination

This act defines the definition of employer. It discusses how the courts should analyze the merits of summary judgments. It places the burden on the employer when the plaintiff submits direct evidence of discrimination. When the plaintiff does not submit direct evidence of discrimination the burden rests with the plaintiff to establish an allegation of discrimination. The act states that either party may demand a jury trial. It states what should be considered and included in damage awards. The act also includes sections called the Whistleblower's Protection Act.

Establishes the Veteran Workforce Act which requires the Office of Administration to develop rules and regulations ensuring a uniform hiring preference for veterans, disabled veterans, and their spouses

This act creates the Veteran Workforce Act. It establishes regulations that each state government agency, department, and executive branch position shall use to ensure Missouri has a uniform hiring preference to appoint And employ veterans, disabled veterans, and surviving spouses. For merit positions, all veterans and surviving spouses who are on a register of eligibles and made a passing grade will have five points added to their final grade and will have their rank determined off the augmented grade. Disabled veterans who meet the criteria will have ten points added to their grade, and their register rank based on the augmented grade. For non-merit system agencies, the above mentioned groups are assessed positively when considering an otherwise qualified candidate and that additional consideration will be given to qualified candidates who are disabled veterans. veteran with a disability is not employed by the state and is unable to enter state service because of his or her disability, the spouse of a veteran with a disability will be given the same hiring preference.

This act creates the Developmental Disability Care Provider Tax Credit Program. This act allows a tax payer to claim a tax credit of fifty percent of the eligible donation made by the tax payer to a developmental disability care provider. All providers will submit an application to the Department of Social Services on behalf of tax payers for the tax credit. The Department of Social Services will ensure all requirements are met. The Program will sunset on December 31, 2016.

Limits the increase in assessed valuation of residential property by the percentage of increase in the federal Social Security benefits for the elderly and disabled who own and live in their principal residence

This act limits the percentage that the assessed valuation of a principal residence can increase if it is owned by a person with a disability. The increase cannot be greater than the increase in an

individual's Social Security benefits in the previous year. This does not include increases due to residential improvements unless the purpose of the improvements was increased accessibility for people with physical disabilities. Those with disabilities will be required to provide proof of disability to the county assessor. This act applies to assessments conducted after December 31, 2012.
