It adds with reckless disregard interfering with the use of a service dog through obstruction, intimidation, or jeopardizing safety as a class B misdemeanor. Anyone who intentionally injures or kills a service dog or allows a dog under his or her ownership or control to do so is guilty of a class D felony. An individual found guilty will make full restitution for

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all damages incurred by the user of the service animal.

The procedures regarding compliance inspections, investigative complaints and license denials, suspensions and revocations shall be provided to the adult day care program upon licensure and also included in the program manual required to be distributed to the programs under this act.

Also, licensed adult day care programs shall receive comparable reimbursement rates as adult day care programs licensed by the Department of Mental Health which provide care, treatment and habilitation exclusively to adults who have a primary diagnosis of a mental disorder, mental illness, or developmental disability for providing similar day program services.
