The act outlines that the training completed by the employees should include techniques for recognizing the symptoms of anaphylaxsis and other severe allergic reactions, the standards and procedures for storing and administering the autoinjector, and emergency follow-up procedures and that it should be approved by the MO Dept. of Health and Senior Services. The act requires that the training be renewed every two years by each authorized individual. It allows epinephrine autoinjectors to be provided to individuals other than the trained individuals under certain conditions. **Status:**
